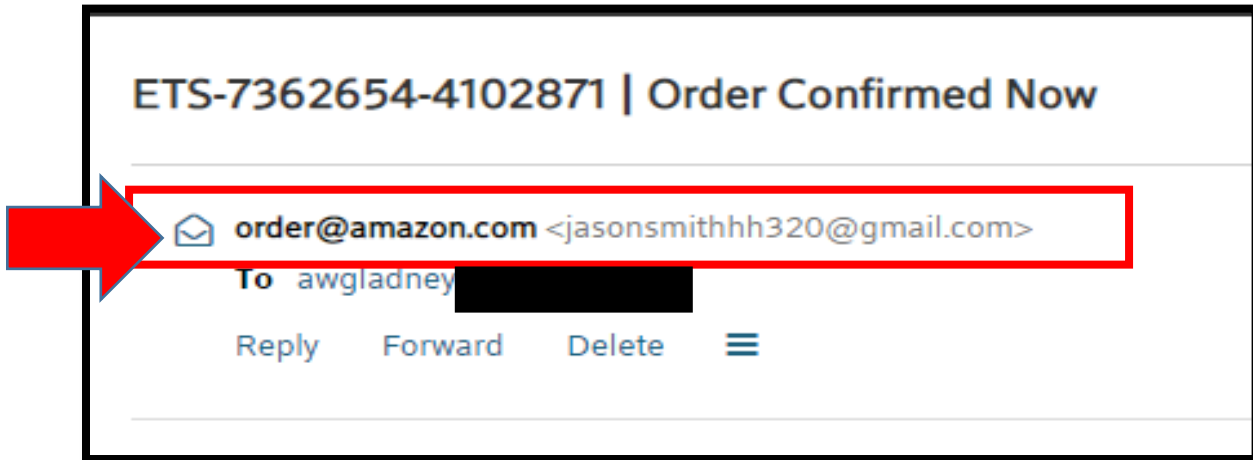
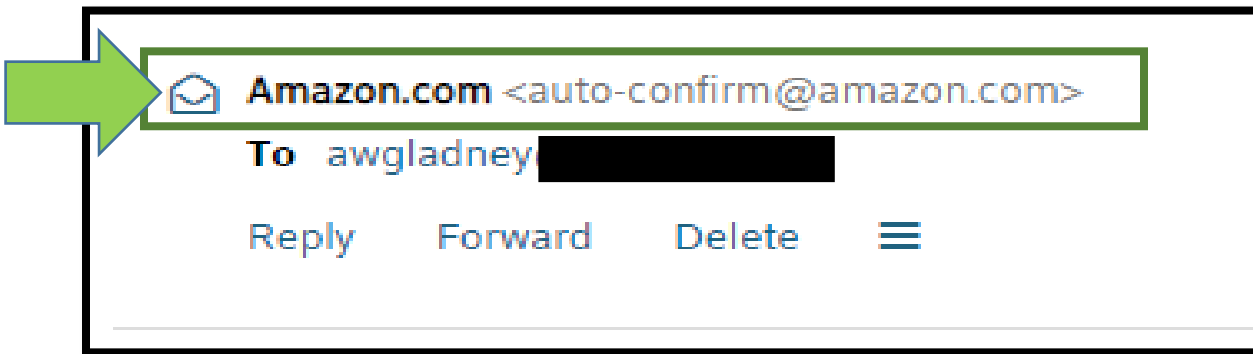


Step 1: READ THE HEADER OF THE EMAIL CAREFULLY!

Note: email address can be manipulated to **appear** differently than where the email originated from.



Note: below is a REAL auto generated email from an Amazon order



Important Note: Professional organized hackers can find a way to manipulate the email address to LOOK LIKE it's from a company. You have to STOP; READ; SPELL and THINK.

ACTION TO TAKE: If the header of the email is NOT CORRECT; NOT FROM THE REAL COMPANY. Trash the email; DO NOT CALL; DO NOT RESPOND; DO NOT FORWARD TO ANYONE.

The hackers play on your biggest emotion of "**FEAR**" to scare you into reaction of the emails.

Hopefully at this point you do not continue to read the email. But you want to learn more continue next page.

Below is the FAKE / SCAM email showing how the hackers will scare you into responding and gathering your account information.

Note: Take a close look at the item subtotal. Do you notice something wrong?

Yes, the TAXES for the product is \$3073.00, but the Order Total is only \$153.65. [FAKE]
